Are you receiving duplicate calendars?

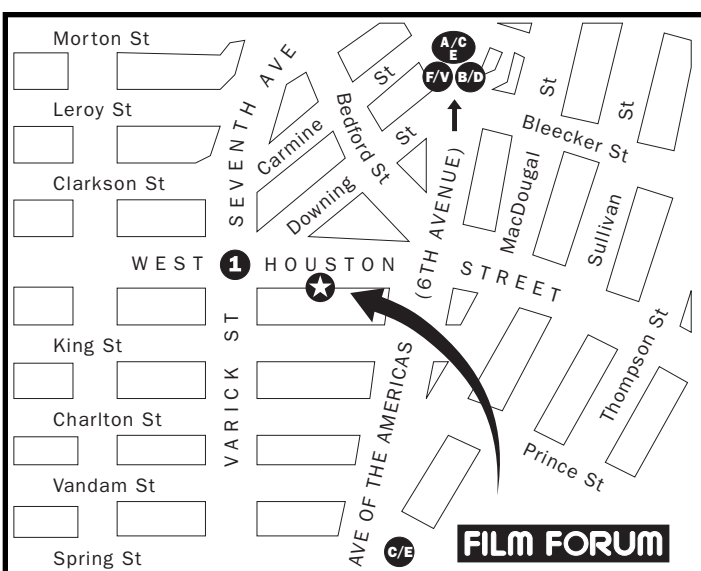

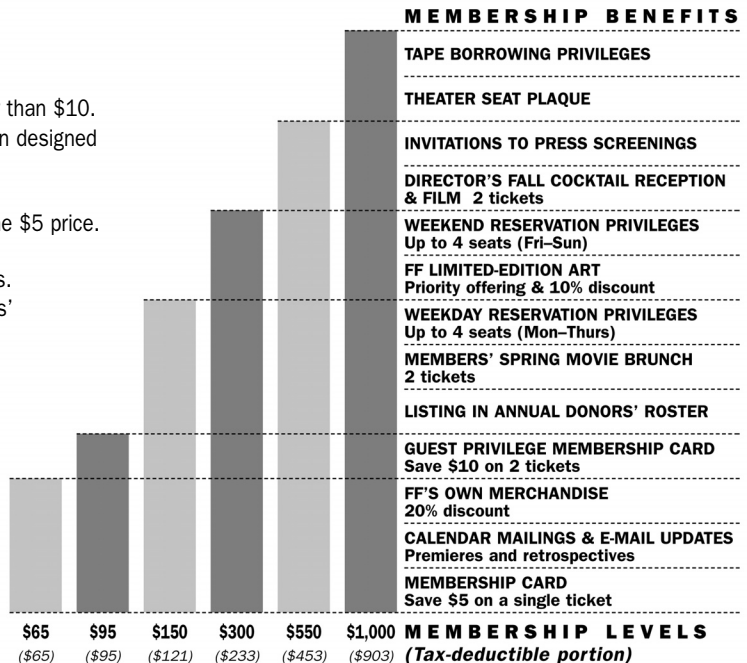

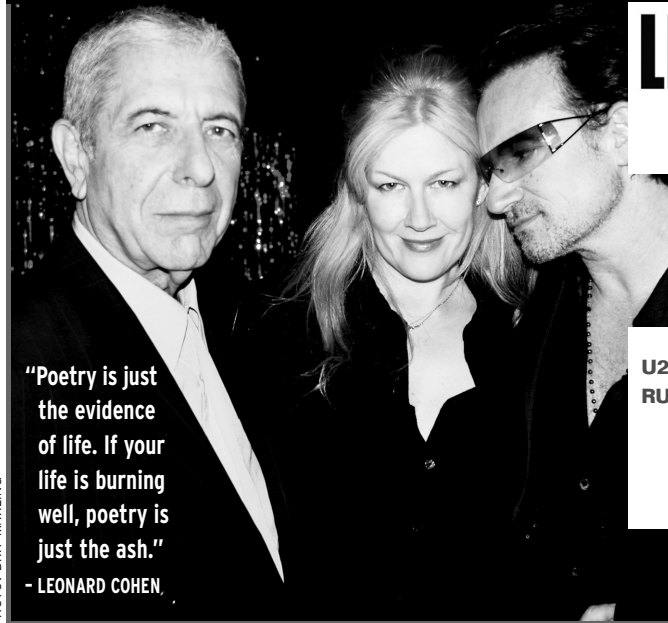
